Threat Assessment: Highlighting the System's Lack of Adaptability

Dr. Tucker identifies some internal and external threats to the one-size-fits-all teacher-led lesson. What would you add to these lists of potential threats that could disrupt the system and make it challenging for teachers to feel successful?

Internal Threats <i>Examples: Learner variability, diversity of skills and abilities, multilingual students</i>	External Threats <i>Examples: Pandemics, advancing AI technology, extreme weather events</i>
